

Raymond Weber, Ph.D., Dean, Community and Technical College

Raymond Weber, Ph.D., is UAA dean for the Community and Technical College (CTC), having served in the role since May 2022. As dean of CTC, Weber oversees operations of twenty-one units with programs located at all of UAA's campuses. Additionally, Weber works with the community campus directors, industry, and other stakeholders to meet Alaska's non-health workforce needs.

Prior to his appointment as dean, Weber served as the interim dean of the Community and Technical College, as well as being a tenured faculty in the Aviation Division teaching courses in multiple areas of aviation including air traffic control, aviation management, aviation maintenance, and professional piloting. He reworked the piloting and aviation management curriculum to be more in line with current industry practices and developed the aeronautical studies emphasis to allow students to use industry experience as credit towards a bachelor's degree. Prior to Weber's time at UAA, he was a non-tenure track faculty at Kent State where he taught courses in aviation and ran flight operations for the aviation program.

Weber holds a Bachelor of Science in commercial aviation from University of North Dakota, a Master of Science in aviation from University of North Dakota, and a Ph.D. in educational psychology with a focus on instructional technology from Kent State University.
